Main Responsibilities

(Piano, guitar, keyboard, violin, flute.) They would be willing to play to others and if possible explain some basic techniques of playing their desired instrument. A good singing voice would be an added bonus. They will be working collaboratively as part of a team. If they feel confident they can be involved in the weekly karaoke sessions.

<u>Training</u>

Full training will be provided. You will be shadowing a DASH employee until you have completed your relevant training.

Reference checks will be required and a DBS will need to be obtained, the cost of this will be covered by DASH.
